JOB DESCRIPTION

POST: Senior Staff Nurse (Band 6 equivalent)

ACCOUNTABLE TO: Head of Healthcare and Nursing

LOCATION: Treloar's site

JOB PURPOSE:

Work within and contribute to the multidisciplinary team as the named nurse for a group of students, ensuring a holistic approach to their health care needs.

Be responsive to the needs of students, assessing, planning and evaluating care provided. Promote and teach best practice in medications management and all clinical procedures, with an awareness of the responsibilities in delegating care to others.

Develop and maintain relationships with staff and students, as a professional role model, and maintain excellent communication, both written and verbal.

Contribute to clinical governance, clinical audit, research and sharing best practice.

RESPONSIBILITIES:

Treloar Trust provides specialist education, nursing, care and therapy for students with physical disabilities, with learning disabilities or difficulties. The post holder will work to ensure the most appropriate nursing, personal and social care for all students.

Clinical

- Undertake the role of house based link nurse, being the first point of contact for students, parents, house and education staff, as well as external agencies of key students
- Encourage students independence and self-advocacy, through promoting self-care
- To work as a member of the nursing team to provide students with individualised care and support in accordance with their care plan, and in line with Treloar's policies and procedures
- To work as a member of the multi-disciplinary team advocating for best practice
- Alongside the Clinical Educator, provide comprehensive training and support to the multidisciplinary team. This may include:- medication administration, gastrostomy feeding, bowel care and other procedures as deemed appropriate, and assist in the assessment, monitoring and supervision of care
- To ensure that delegation of tasks and duties is carried out in line with NMC guidelines and takes into account not only the activity but also the situation
- To provide assessment, advice and treatment for student's physical and mental health issues, minor injuries and exacerbation of illnesses while working within one's own scope of practice, and refer to external agencies as required.
- To maintain accurate, timely and detailed records
- Respond and attend any emergency situation across site, deliver the necessary emergency treatment or first aid; and respond to medication errors in a timely manner
- Contribute to clinical governance, through participating in clinical audit, research and awareness of best practice
- To participate in residential trips as the accompanying nurse
- To participate in a range of shifts, and the nurse on call rota.

Professional

- To adhere to the Nursing and Midwifery Council Code and be conversant with the scope of professional practice and related guidance
- Maintain NMC registration through revalidation, keeping up to date with mandatory training and CPD, and viewing all feedback as a learning opportunity
- To adhere to and operate within Trust and National guidelines and procedures for safeguarding of children and vulnerable adults

Communication

- To communicate in a sensitive and professional manner with students, taking into account potential barriers to, and aids for, communication
- To demonstrate enhanced communication skills with students, parents or guardians, taking into account mental capacity, and any support needed for decision making to enable the students to participate in decisions regarding their health
- To promote and maintain good relationships with all staff, and external health care professionals
- To attend departmental meetings and be actively involved in the implementation of departmental policies and changes to working practices
- To challenge poor practice in a timely and professional manner

Management

- To work autonomously using clinical expertise to assess, treat or refer appropriately
- To supervise more junior nurses, clinical assistants, health care assistants, and student nurses, recognising their valuable contributions
- To undertake flexible working hours, negotiated to meet the needs of the department
- To be responsible for the safe use of equipment, following risk assessments, care plans and clinical guidelines, promptly reporting unsafe or broken equipment

Organisational

- To participate in clinical audit and research
- To contribute to clinical governance and meeting CQC regulatory requirements
- Maintain a professional, safe and tidy environment following IPC and uniform policies
- To actively participate in performance development review programme, and clinical supervision
- To be aware of and comply with Treloar Trust, departmental and national guidelines

Other duties

- To comply with policies and procedures relating to safeguarding, health and safety, equality and diversity, confidentiality and data protection, reporting concerns to an appropriate person
- To undertake any other such duties or general tasks and hours of work as may reasonably be required and any other responsibilities, which may from time to time, be delegated by your manager
- A job description is not a rigid or inflexible document but acts to provide guidelines to the duties expected while in the post, and may be reviewed in the light of changing demands.

Supporting Information

The post holder will need to demonstrate that they are able to work under the following conditions.

Physical Effort

- To be able to support student whilst transferring, for example from chair to bed, with or without manual handling equipment
- To be able to attend rapidly to a medical emergency anywhere on site

Mental Effort

- To be able to prioritise workload and direct others to balance student related needs in accordance with departmental standards
- To maintain periods of concentration when working with students
- To be able to change to the rapidly changing needs and priorities of a busy department

Emotional Effort

- To work with students with physical disabilities, and chronic and life limiting conditions
- To work with parents under stress
- To work with students who display challenging behaviour
- To work in distressing and highly emotional situations

Working Conditions

- To be able to work in an environment where there is frequent exposure to bodily fluids
- To be resilient within a busy and demanding workplace
